Pam has presented at local, statewide and national trainings in regards to abuse of people with disabilities, trauma informed care and children with disabilities, multi-disciplinary response to crime victims with disabilities, healthy relationships and people with disabilities and many more topics. She is a trained expert witness in the area of sexual abuse and people with disabilities.

In 2010, Pam was hired on as a consultant for Wisconsin Coalition Against Sexual Assault (WCASA) as the Statewide Developmental Disabilities Specialist. In this role she trains sexual assault service providers in the state of Wisconsin how to respond to and support victims with disabilities. She also does trainings for professionals in the disability community and links them with local resources in sexual assault victim services. These two entities have existed in silos for years and it is Pam's goal to bridge these silos and start the collaboration between them.
